Co., Pa. (BCDB 26, p. 35). This land was located in the Blairton area of Ber. Co. WVa. Christopher Folk purchased two other tracts of land in Ber. Co., Va.

Ber. Co. DB 11, p. 171, March 13, 1793, John Ludwick Summers and Elizabeth his wife sold to Christopher Folck for 200 lbs. a certain tract of land between the head of Fillhazys branch and Mill Creek containing 15 $\frac{1}{4}$ 1/2 acres.

Ber. Co. DB 13, p. 229, 11 Jan 1797, Daniel Davis and Mary his wife sold to Christopher Folck for 850 lbs. part of 176 acres granted by the late Fairfax to Samuel Thatcher 17 Aug. 1771. Located near the east side of North Mountain containing 160 acres 2 rods 17 poles.

Shortly before Christopher died he deeded this land to his son Jacob Faulk (BCDB 22, p. 15-a lost deed book). The tract of land was sold 23 Nov. 1812 by Jacob Small and Peter Reel Jr. of Jacob Faulk decd. to George Small for \$1,065.10. A stone house was located here which was sold 1950-50 to Ralph Barkhart who erected his present museum building on West King St. in Martinsburg from the stone. BCDB Superior Court DB 1, p. 347.

The 15 $\frac{1}{4}$ acres tilehance Branch land of Christopher Faulk was sold by his executors 12 Dec. 1820 (BCDB 24, p. 264).
