Know all men by these presents that I John Louch of March township in Lancaster County and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania for and in consideration of the sum of ninety six dollars to me in hand paid by the within named Humphrey Fullerton, the receipt of which I do hereby confess and acknowledge have granted bargained and sold conveyed and forever released and by these presents do for myself and my heirs grant bargain sell confirm and forever release unto the said Humphrey Fullerton his heirs and assigns all and singular my right title claim interest and demand in law or equity of in or to the within described and bounded land and premises with the appurtenances unto the said Humphrey Fullerton his heirs and assigns forever In witness whereof I the said John Louch have hereunto set my hand and seal this 5th day of February A.D. 1808.

This indenture made the sixteenth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty between Christian Stauffer the elder of March township in the county of Lancaster and State of Pennsylvania and Elizabeth his wife of the one part and Joseph Lach of the other part witnesseth that the said Christian Stauffer and Elizabeth his wife for and in consideration of the sum of two thousand eight hundred dollars lawful money of Pennsylvania to the said Christian Stauffer well and truly in hand paid by the said Joseph Lach at and before the executing and delivery hereof the receipt and payment whereof they do hereby acknowledge and thereof do acquit and forever discharge the said Joseph Lach his heirs executors and administrators by these presents have and each of them hath granted bargained sold aliened conveyed released and confirmed and by these presents do and each of them doth grant bargain sell alien convey release and confirm unto the said Joseph Lach and to his heirs and assigns all what certain plantation or piece of land situate in March township in the county of Westmoreland aforesaid bounded and described as follows to wit Beginning at a post thence by land of Charles Schell March two degrees west two hundred and twenty six perches to a white oak thence by land of Oriskany two degrees south eighty eight degrees west one hundred and thirty five perches and eight tenths of a perch to a post thence by land of which this is a part south two degrees east two hundred seventy seven perches to a post thence by the same north eighty eight degrees east one hundred and seven perches to a post and thence north sixty five degrees east thirty perches and an half to the place beginning containing two hundred acres and eighty perches net measure. In the same more or less being part of a certain tract called Richland for which a patent was granted to Bernard Lutz dated the fourth day of June 1796 with
