#### 1995 Berks County Reunion

The 1995 Sauvage/Sowash/Soash Family Reunion will be held on Jun 30, Jul 1 & 2 at the Holiday Inn, 2545 N. Fifth Street, Reading, PA. 19601 (215 929-4741). Room rates will be 65.72 per night (double occupancy) or \$72.08 per night (three or four people). Please make your own reservations. All motel reservations must be made by May 30 (form enclosed).

Reading is the county seat of Berks County where Johannes Sauvage purchased land on 20 Mar 1743. He and his family lived in the county until his death in 1761. His son Henry and grandson Daniel (2) served in the Revolutionary War from Berks County. Both John Sowash, Sr. (1) and Daniel Sowash (2), progenitors of the Soash/Sowash families, were born in Rockland Twp., Berks Co., PA.

Most of the family migrated to Westmoreland County, PA. by the late 1770's. However, some of the family remained in Berks County and retained the original Savage name. Their exact connection to the family has yet to proven, but descendants are still in the area.

Current plans include a visit to the Christ Evangelical Lutheran (Mertz) Church in Dryville. Although the original church building is gone, Mertz Church is where John Heinrich Sawash married Anna Esther Schneider on 27 Nov 1749. John Heinrich was the son of Johannes, the original emigrant and the father of both John Sowash Sr (1) and Daniel Sowash (2). We will be able to see the original church records that record their marriage. The church does not normally allow the public to view these records, so we are indeed fortunate. We will then be able to visit the original land that Johannes Sowass purchased in 1743. Although nothing remains from that time, it is the first known plot of land owned by our family in America.

At 1:00 p.m., we will go to the courthouse where we will be able to see the original will of Johannes Sauvage that was made 16 Feb 1761 and signed with his mark. Also on display will be all of the estate papers that were connected with his estate. We are also planning on a speaker on the early history of Berks County.

On Saturday, Merwin is trying to arrange a tour in the area if there is enough interest. Please be sure to indicate your interest on the return sheet. There are many attractions close to the Reading area, including Lancaster County, center of the Pennsylvania Dutch settlements, Brandywine Revolutionary Battlefield, Valley Forge National Park, Hershey Chocolate World, and the outlet malls of Reading itself. On the 3rd and 4th of July, Gettysburg presents a reenactment of the original battles that is well worth a visit.

### Directions to Holiday Inn, Reading

From the west: Take Penn. Turnpike 176
East to Reading Exit 21 and then US
222 North (Allentown) to the Fifth
Street exit.

From the east: Take Penn. Turnpike 176 West to Morgantown Exit 22 and then follow 176 North to US 422 West. Take US 222 North and then the Fifth Street exit.

From the northeast: Take 178 West/US 222 to SR 100 South at Trexlertown. Follow 100S 3 miles and then turn right onto US 222 South. Continue 35 miles to Fifth Street in Reading.

From the south: Use I 95 North to 1695 West around Baltimore and then 183 North. At York, PA, follow US 30 E to Lancaster, then US 222 North (Allentown) to the Fifth Street exit of Reading.

#### Cemetery Projects

The gravestone for Susanna (Weber) Sowash (2C/W/) is on order and will be set this spring. We retain enough money in the cemetery fund to pay the remaining \$466.10 on this stone.

The graves of George and Elizabeth (Bankert) Sowash (1J) at Union Cemetery in Irwin, PA., are unmarked. There is a large stone in the cemetery with just the name Sowash. It would cost about \$300 to have their names added to the stone. If we wish to buy two individual stones for their graves, the cost would be about \$1,500.00.

#### Buyer Beware

A group advertising itself as the Sowash Family News (250 Coolidge Street, Midvale, UT 84047) is not really a Sowash/Soash family group.

They extract phone numbers from national phone lists, and death records from the Social Security files. The book contains no real family history.

They also advertise a family crest (we can't even find our roots in Europe, let alone claim to be nobility!) and other gimmicks.
