Visit the nearly intact tract of land that Johannes purchased in 1743 as well as the cemetery, vacated in 1865, where Johannes, his wife Susanna and other family members were probably buried.

The funeral for John Sowash Sr (died 1827) would have been conducted here and he is buried right outside the front door.

Brief Sauvage/Sowash/Soash Family History

Johannes Sauvage (French for "of the woods" or "savage") was born about 1698, probably in the area of Alsace-Lorraine area of France. This area is on the French-German border and has changed hands many times during wars in the area. Johannes is the German version of French "Jean" and Sauvage is definitely French. At the time, France was a Catholic nation so many Protestants fled to Germany to escape religious repression.

Johannes Sauvage, his wife Susannah and at least two children sailed for America on the "Winter Galley". The ship left from Rotterdam, Holland, making a stop in Deal, England. Only English ships were allowed to make the trip to the new colonies. They arrived in Philadelphia on 05 Sep 1738. Most of the passengers were listed as Wurtembergers, Hannoverians, Saxons and Alsatians.

Johannes apparently could not read or write as he put his mark rather than signing his name. He also put his mark on his will, which was in German, rather than signing his name. This is important as much of the Anglicization of the Sauvage name probably would not have happened had he been able to write/spell his own name. The French pronunciation of Sauvage (sō văj) is very close to Sowash, especially in the German speaking community. Johannes settled in Berks County where he purchased land in 1743. Today that tract of land is still nearly completely intact.

Johannes died in 1761 in Berks County, PA where his will (in German) was proved. He was probably buried on his land in a family graveyard that was vacated in 1865.

The two proven children of Johannes are Anna Elizabetha and Johan Heinrich/Henry Sowash. Nothing is known of Anna Elizabetha. It is probable that there was another son as there is a branch of the family that remained in Berks County and retained the Americanized Savage name.

Henry was born about 1731 in France or Germany. He was naturalized in 1761 after the death of his father. He married Maria Anna Esther Schneider on 27 Nov 1749 in Mertz Church, Rockland Twp., Berks Co., PA. Their marriage and the baptism of their daughter Johanna Elizabetha (26 Jan 1751) are recorded in the Mertz Church book.

Both Henry and his oldest son Daniel served in the Revolutionary War, allowing descendants to join Sons or Daughters of the American Revolution.

After the death of his wife about 1783 (probably buried in the family graveyard), Henry moved to Virginia with his son-in-law and by 1785, he had moved to Westmoreland County, PA. His will was proved 10 Jun 1799. No record of his burial has been found, but the family association erected a memorial stone in Brush Creek Cemetery.

Henry and Maria had four known daughters and two sons. Most Sowash/Soash families in America today are descended from these two sons <u>Daniel</u> and <u>John Sowash Sr.</u>
